SHEDDING LIGHT ON CHABAD...

As a non-practicing Jew, why would I participate in Chabad programming?

Chabad of Bonita Springs is a place where all Jews come together to connect and feel a sense of belonging, regardless of religious background or affiliation. In fact, the vast majority of people who participate in programs at Chabad are not Orthodox. The teachings of Chabad are imbued with Chassidic spirit and joy, but in no way is the commitment to a religious lifestyle a prerequisite to one's acceptance at Chabad functions. In fact, the programs and projects of Chabad are designed specifically to meet the needs of the unaffiliated.

What do you want to accomplish with your Chabad Jewish Center in Bonita Springs?

We want to bring people together to create a vibrant Jewish community. Through social events and holiday celebrations, we hope to foster a sense of family in our towns.

Equally important, we strive to create an environment where Jews from every walk of life can feel comfortable to learn about their heritage and traditions at their own pace, in a welcoming setting.

Finally, we envision building a Chabad Jewish Center that will have programs for people of all ages, from babies to seniors. We hope to open a Sunday Hebrew School and a summer day camp to serve our school-age children, offer an array of adult education courses and classes, and celebrate the Jewish holidays with the entire community. Many of these programs are already under way, others will take shape in the near future.

Are you supported financially by the Chabad Lubavitch Headquarters in New York?

It is the policy of the world-wide Chabad movement that each center is supported by the community it serves. Funding for local Chabad programs is solicited locally. None of the money contributed in Bonita Springs is sent to Chabad headquarters in New York - all funds donated remain right here in our community. Likewise, we do not receive funding from a central fund.

To help pay for our programming, overhead and administrative costs, we rely solely on people like you, who are interested in creating a Jewish presence in Bonita Springs.
